Dear iCARE Partners, Supporters, and Volunteers,

The Great Shape! Inc. iCARE program has completed our return mission to The Bahamas, serving both Exuma and Nassau. Our free eye care clinics, held from April 28 to May 2, were big successes. For the first time we conducted more than 1 clinic in a week, creating an amazing 11 clinics (11 schools and 1 resort staff) in Exuma over 3 days, and an additional staff clinic in Nassau for the Sandals employees. Our primary objective for the mission was screening all of the children in all of the schools in Exuma, an island southeast of Nassau.



Our small team of 21 volunteer arrived in Nassau and flew to Exuma on Sunday. We were lodged at Sandals Emerald Bay where we were the only occupants, as the property is transitioning to a Beaches Resort. We were well taken care of by the small resort crew. On Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday we were mobile, traveling by bus to the various schools. When we arrived at each, we had to determine an appropriate space for the clinic and quickly set up, serve the students and faculty, then move on to the next school on our list. Some of these spaces were quite small and challenging, but we made each one work. On Thursday we flew back to Nassau and conducted the staff clinic at Sandals Grand Bahamian the next day.

In total we served 1,384 patients with eye exams, health screenings, medications, and glasses (reading, sun, and prescription). 26 received pre-made prescription glasses and another 303 prescriptions will be custom made and returned to our patients in early September.

According to the census of April 2023, the population of Exuma is 7,293. We served 1,028 on Exuma alone, which is 14% of the island. Two years ago we served 28% of the island, which included very few children as schools were not in session and most of them were in Nassau with family.

Our health evaluation team screened patients over 45 years of age with a family history of hypertension, diabetes, those not recently tested, or those who asked for a test. Anyone exhibiting unhealthy levels were educated on methods to restore health and referred to their local health care provider for immediate care. The highest blood pressure was recorded at 181/151. The highest glucose level was recorded at 345.

- Served 356 patients (all in depth exams)
- Dispensed 9 pre-made prescription glasses and will make another 114 custom
- 158 health screenings for diabetes and/or hypertension



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Work in total:

- conducted 1,384 vision exams
- served 12 clinics (11 schools and 2 staff) 1 clinic consisted of 2 schools
- performed 270 hypertension screenings and 105 diabetes screenings
- dispensed 329 prescription glasses (303 to be custom made)
- distributed and donated 760 reading glasses
- distributed and donated 700 sunglasses
- made several pathology referrals to the local or private healthcare system
- retail value of medications dispensed and donated is US\$133,186
- estimated total value in goods and services is US\$371,663

Since our inception 16 years ago, iCARE has conducted 34 weeks of clinics and 8 weeks of cataract surgery – providing the following critical services and goods free of cost to the beautiful people of Jamaica, Turks & Caicos, Antigua, St. Lucia, Barbados, The Bahamas, and Grenada at a conservatively, estimated total value of over US\$19.84 million. This includes:

- 63,389 eye exams and procedures (includes 323 cataract surgeries, 77 MIG surgeries, 820 SLT laser procedures, 160 diabetic retinopathy PRP laser procedures, 2 laser retinopexies, 1 IOL reposition, and 1 ectropian)
- 128,076 glasses (prescription, reading, and sunglasses)







